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




NOVEMBER 11

2023 BRAD MILLER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The Southwestern Ohio Hemophilia Foundation (SWOHF) has awarded the 2023 Brad Miller Memorial Scholarship to **Chloe Henninger**. Chloe, a senior at Wright State University, is majoring in Early Elementary Education with the goal of becoming a kindergarten teacher. "I chose kindergarten because I feel I work best with that age of kids," stated Chloe. The \$2000 Brad Miller Memorial Scholarship is awarded annually to a student with a bleeding disorder that is




